Transnational Corporations Review (TNCR) is a journal dedicated to providing economic, policy and business information and analysis of current issues in TNCs, FDI, innovation, and development. A rough estimate suggests that the three hundred largest TNCs own or control at least a quarter of the world's productive assets. China's openness to foreign investment is reshaping global value chains and affecting investment decisions worldwide. *TNCR* is created to address TNCs and China's development-related issues. To ensure the timely and widespread dissemination of the information, this journal is published both electronically and physically.

EDITORIAL POLICY

TNCR welcomes submission of papers or articles dealing with any aspects of TNCs, FDI, innovation and development related to China and international economics. Authors from business, government and academic communities, in particularly from youth professionals in the China and world economics, are encouraged to submit papers and articles to this unique journal.

The editorial advisory board of *TNCR* is comprised of well-known individuals from public and private sectors. The primary role of the members of the board is to ensure that the journal consistently publishes quality materials and remains editorially independent. To ensure that the journal publishes papers and articles of the highest standard, all submissions will be subjected to a double-blind review. Reviewers from the advisory board and/or relevant organizations will be asked to either accept or reject each submission. To facilitate expedient publication, all aspects of the process from submission to correspondence and editing are done electronically.

In order to circulate the work of the authors selected for publication as widely as possible, *TNCR* retains the copyright to all documents. To be specific, *TNCR* retains exclusive rights including, but not limited to, the right to publish, republish, transmit, distribute, and otherwise use all published documents (articles, editorials, comments and so on) appeared.

GUIDELINES FOR CONTRIBUTORS

Submission of papers or articles focused on TNCs, FDI, innovation and development issues are warmly welcomed. In keeping with the journal's mission, submissions dealing with topics related to China are strongly encouraged. Preference will be given to papers or articles that focus on clear policy implications. Occasionally, *TNCR* may publish special issues on particular topics; individuals with proposals for the special issues are encouraged to contact the managing editor(s).

Articles for publication should be in both English and Chinese. Authors are requested to submit their papers or articles by email to sino@tnc-online.org. Submissions should be sent as Microsoft Word documents (or an application compatible with Word), accompanied by a statement that the text (or parts thereof) has not been published or submitted for publication elsewhere.

Normally, articles should not exceed 15 double-spaced pages (3,000 words). All articles should have an abstract with key words not exceeding 150 words. Study notes should be between 5 and 10 double-spaced pages. Book reviews and other information should be around 1,000 words, unless they are review essays, in which case they may be the length of an article. Footnotes should be placed at the bottom of the page they refer to. An alphabetical list of references should appear at the end of the manuscript. Appendices, tables and figures should be on separate sheets of paper and placed at the end of the manuscript.

Manuscripts should be typed and double-spaced (including references) with wide margins. Pages should be numbered consecutively. The first page of the manuscript should contain: (i) title; (ii) name(s) and institutional affiliation(s) of the author(s); and (iii) mailing address, e-mail address, telephone and facsimile numbers of the author (or primary author, if more than one). (iv) author (s) biographical information with a recent picture. Authors should ensure that the submitted paper contains an *Abstract*, *Introduction* and *Conclusion* highlighting the policy implications.

TNCR editors work on a volunteer basis. Support is expected for the *TNCR* high-level peer reviews, editing and printing from a contribution of US\$20 per printed page payable by the contributors and/or the contributors' affiliated institutions or granting agencies. For submissions that are in either English or Chinese only, an extra charge of US\$10 per printed page may be applied to cover the costs of translating the submission into the second language of the journal. Contribution does not affect editorial decisions. Instructions for contribution will be given once a submission has been accepted for publication.

TNCR welcomes subscription. This journal takes an innovative, comprehensive look into a wide range of issues facing corporations operating internationally. The journal focuses on policy-oriented information and analyses relevant to the activities of TNCs and those affected by their activities.
